


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Long - Life Pressure Switch Replacement Kit

REPLACEMENT INSTRUCTIONS



REMOVING DEFECTIVE SWITCH:

- Remove the switch cover by loosening the cover screw on Type I switch.
- Disconnect the two wire spade connectors; on a sealed Type II switch clip wires close to switch.
- Remove the switch body by loosening the two side screws. Remove carefully, avoiding any damage to the threads in the plastic pump housing.
- 4. Remove the black (plastic piston guide on Type I and rubber sealing disk behind the switch). Some older models may also have a white teflon disk and o-ring as well, and this should be discarded.
- Clean the plastic housing cavity and the front of the pump with fresh water.

REPLACING WITH THE NEW LONG - LIFE SWITCH:

 Select new switch diaphragm by matching the check valve material* with one of the enclosed switch diaphragms. The diaphragms are marked V-Viton, B-Buna and E-EPDM (match EPDM with Santoprene check valves). Carefully place the new switch diaphragm in the pump housing with the outside diameter raised seal ring, on the diaphragm, facing forward toward switch (see illustration above).

- 2. Place the new switch on the pump aligning the mounting holes (ensuring the switch is centered on the switch cavity). Press switch into recess, then insert the new screws which came with the new switch. Carefully turn the screws counter clockwise to find the old threads. When you feel a "step or click", turn the screw clockwise being sure not to cross thread. Run one screw in to a snug fit, then install the second screw to a snug fit. Torque each screw to 9 10 inch pounds for a water tight seal.
- Attach pump switch wires to new switch using the spade connectors which were attached to the old switch or see step #4. Attach motor wire to one switch spade and the power lead to the other switch spade.
- 4. To replace a switch with wire leads sealed into the switch, cut off motor wire and (+) positive power wire close to switch. Dress ends of wires, attach and crimp splice connectors securely to 6" wire leads that came with new switch. In very moist or wet locations, wrap splice connector with

In very moist or wet locations, wrap splice connector with electrical tape or fill connector with sealing compound as shown in drawing.

*If check valve material is now known, select the E-EPDM for all potable water and sea water, B-Buna for petrochemicals, and V-Viton for higher temperature applications.

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
